Propelling Students to Future Success

The Special Education Foundation's mission is to assist students with disabilities in achieving success in ways not supported by tax dollars and aims to provide tools and opportunities they need to succeed. The Special Education Foundation (SEF) established the John Cary Scholarship in 2016, recognizing the late superintendent of the Special School District (SSD) of St. Louis County, for his commitment to excellence and his support of students with disabilities. Each year, SEF awards five \$5,000 scholarships to selected students who are entering post-secondary education. The selected students will reflect the characteristics most admired by John Cary — resiliency, courage, and determination. The scholarship committee looks for evidence of future success by considering academics, leadership and community volunteer activities, and success in athletics and/or the arts.



How It Works

- Each school year, students planning to attend a four-year college or university can submit an application through the SEF website, accompanied by their school transcript.
- Once a student's application is received, SEF contacts the student's SSD teacher to complete the Teacher Next Steps form on the SEF website and submit a letter of recommendation.
- Financial needs and teacher recommendations are also considered.
- Applications are reviewed, and students are selected by an SEF committee including members of the Board of Directors and key staff.

Well-rounded individuals, particularly those with exceptional achievement in a particular area, are more likely to be successful applicants.
