

Kid-to-Camp



Fun Places, Smiling Faces

Camp programs help to maintain educational momentum for students with disabilities during extended breaks throughout the year. Camps allow students to interact with other kids, develop friendships and relationships, and build confidence and independence.

The Special Education Foundation's (SEF) Kid-to-Camp program helps provide funding for families with students with disabilities served by the Special School District (SSD) who may be burdened by additional expenses. Camperships are awarded based on financial need and student benefits.

Eligibility & Policies

The applicant must have an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) and receive services through the Special School District (504 Plans are not eligible).

Families may apply for assistance for **one camp session per calendar year** at a maximum funding request of **\$1,000 for one child and \$1500 for 2+ children**.

How It Works

- A parent or guardian completes a Kid-to-Camp application through the SEF website.
- A most recent parent/guardian 1040 tax form (pages 1-2) must accompany the campership application.
- Two letters of recommendation are required: one must be from the student's teacher.
- Funding awarded is only applied to the camp fee; other fees, such as registration or transportation, are not covered.
- SEF will notify parents, and funds will be sent directly to the camp once the student is enrolled.
